Have you even been involved in a discussion where folks were debating the difference between a want...and a need? So, how did that go? Did everybody agree? Does everybody ever agree on anything? Soooo....chances are that they didn't and that some folks felt pretty strongly about their side of the discussion.

How do we know? How do we draw that line and say—these things are *always necessities, required for life*, something that I really truly *need* versus affirming that whatever it is that we're discussing is instead just something that ranks really high up there on our wish list?

Well, if it's let up to the person who really really wants whatever it is, the answer is probably gonna be a bit...skewed. "But dude, I really do *need* that new phone because it has a better camera and more memory and I *need* that because so many people I know have it and they're taking all these pictures and I'm not because my junky phone is just a dog! Want or need?

It might seem easy to roll our eyes and be like, "Easy one. Total want. Not need, want" IF you're that one being asked instead of the one asking. So your camera isn't the best. You're right there with your friends, why do you need to take a picture? Turn you phone off and actually hang with your friends and then maybe, um, REMEMBER IT! 
