#### A Christmas Favorite

Recently, I took the opportunity to do something that I try to do every year around Christmas. It has become an annual tradition for me that always seems to somehow focus my thoughts of Christmas in the direction that is truly grounded in things like joy, peace, hope and love. My tradition is to read or watch some version of Charles Dickens' short story, A Christmas Carol.

I know that this story has been done what seems like an endless number of times. The character of Scrooge has been played by everyone from actors that have been knighted by the Queen of England to Scrooge McDuck who is accompanied by other famous Disney mainstays such as Mickey Mouse and Jiminy Cricket.

I really like just about every adaptation of this story (honestly, my favorite Scrooge is played by George C Scott) and there are *a lot* of adaptations. No matter how many times it is reinterpreted, no matter how many times it is glitzed up or made to look like authentic 19<sup>th</sup> century London what makes it so powerful for me is that it centers on the crux of what Christmas is really all about. It is powerful and meaningful to me because, no matter the players or the set or the use of technology, the message conveyed in this story is the message that God conveyed to us all in the birth of Jesus. That message is of course, hope!

God is love. This is an unchanging truth. But in the course of our "us" centered human existence we separated ourselves from God. The love has always been there, we just chose to go another direction. As such, the world had become as self-centered and miserly as the opening scene in which Ebenezer Scrooge would begrudge Bob Cratchit a meager lump of coal for a dying fire on a cold winter day.

Scrooge had become so focused on his own gain that he had lost sight of what real gain is. His life was an exercise in the preservation of quantity, and it had cost him every measure that gives life its quality. In his miserly state, even though Scrooge had accumulated great means, he readily denied the invitation to help others with the most basic of needs. But, in God's plan, even for Ebenezer Scrooge there was hope.

Jacob Marley, Scrooge's now former partner in life who now suffers a torturous afterlife for his own selfishness, bottom lined it all. When confronted with Scrooge's claim that Marley had been a good man of business, with a ghoulish lament, Jacob informed Scrooge that humanity was his business...or at least, that it should have been. From here the story tells of the three ghosts whose visits help transform Ebenezer from self-centered crotchety miserly to someone who "knew how to keep Christmas well, if any man alive possessed the knowledge."

Hope for change. Hope for improvement. Hope that we as individuals and we as a society can move or be moved toward a healthier, happier, more holy life. This is the gift of God in Christ. In the gift of Jesus, God gives us all the hope that, without him we could never know.

This is the hope that inspires us to believe that love is real and available to us. It is the hope that love can bring about change for the better in any circumstance. God knew the world needed this hope and so he sent His son so long ago. God knew we needed this hope and so Jesus lived and died and rose that we may know God's gifts for all time. God knew we needed this hope, and so our Lord inspired Mr. Dickens to write this short story that continues to inspire so many today. God knows we still need this hope....and perennially new versions of "A Christmas Carol" arise. God knows we need this hope, and every year Christmas comes and brings with it the reminder that in God, in the Spirit and in Christ, hope is always lovingly given!

And of course there are the memories of watching Christmas specials while munching on popcorn and sipping cocoa. And seeing Santa come into town on the Coast Guard boat up the river and being lead to his workshop on a fire engine (yes I said a boat and a fire engine) and candle light worship service at midnight.

As I was reflecting on all of these things, I started to think of the changes that have taken place in my life and the world over the years. I've start new traditions in the south, my family has changed in so many different ways. Some changes have been good, great even, some have been a little more painful than others. I know many of you can relate.

Many of us have traditions that we hold tightly to and new memories that we are establishing with our own children. Many of us have experienced things this year that have changed the canvas of our lives and so, our traditions are becoming things of the past or they are at least being put on hold until we can pick them back up again when our lives get back to normal. Not to mention that the holiday season is especially stressful on our schedules and so we are often forced to decide which party, program or celebration to attend. Even our children's schedules are packed and we have to make decisions for them and inevitably we disappoint them when they don't get to participate in something. Life just seems so busy and overwhelming. Even if your life has been calm and you have had a tremendous year, I'm sure you have been walking along side those you love who have struggled and so you've been a burden bearer. Life, after all, is filled with vacillations between peaks and valleys. One minute you are up and one minute you and down. There is no surefire way to see the future and when we are in a valley we often yearn for the "good ol' days".

Here is the amazing thing about not only this season, but every season of our life: EMMANUEL, God is with us. In the midst of our lives, in every moment, God is in it. In the changes, in the traditions, in the decisions, in joy, in pain, and in this very moment...GOD IS IN IT! Our only true task is to not get stuck in yesterday or worry about what tomorrow shall bring, but to breathe in the presence of the Lord and to live into every moment as it comes.

I pray that while we celebrate the birth of the sweet baby Jesus, you spend this season experiencing the gift of the Already God and that you experience that awesome grace that he showers on each of us. This coincides with the PCUSA safety measures and will be mandatory moving forward for nursery volunteers, teachers, VBS volunteers, Wonderful Wednesday volunteers, youth advisors and chaperones, and special events where children attend. The background checks are paid for by the church and will be submitted by Judy Clinton who is the only person who will see them. As of January, all volunteers should go by the church office to pick up and fill out the form and turn it in to Judy Clinton. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and consideration in this effort to uphold our safe sanctuary policy.
