CHECK THIS OUT!.....According to multiple sources on the Internet, the average amount of remotely conscious decisions an adult makes each day equals about 35,000. WOW!....35,000 decisions! Now, let's pair that with the fact that God is love. What do we get?

We get 35,000 opportunities a day to share in the greatest feelings, expressions and experiences that life can ever offer! So, let's check out what that looks like in real time.

This week I had the opportunity to visit a number of people who don't have the opportunity at the end of the day to do things like go home, decide what they would like to have for dinner or sit on their own familiar comfy sofa and watch tv. Some of these folks were in hospitals, assisted care facilities and even homeless. Others were suffering from mistakes they had made in the form of unhealthy decisions about relationships, money or the use of their time. (You can fill in the blanks here as we are all sinners and come hugely short of the glory of God!) Whatever the case may be, each of these folks were in need and I had the opportunity to say to myself, as the Biblical Paul says, "For what I received I pass(ed) on to you...

God gives it to us first. We receive it and it changes everything about us. It does this because God's love is stronger than everything else in our lives. What happens when we live into the love God has poured into us is kind of like what happens when we pour red food coloring into a glass of water. (or into a batch of chocolate cake batter---did you know that Red Velvet cake is actually just chocolate cake with red food coloring & cream cheese frosting?—cool huh?) In short, it changes everything in a way that it can never be undone! And, the change is so incredibly awesome for everybody!!!!

It is not easy to minister to someone sick or hurting. Maybe it can be tough because we might be afraid we will "catch" what they are suffering from. Maybe it's tough because seeing or hearing or even smelling (real stuff) illness and/or pain is unsettling and even at times scary. This stuff can remind us of our own hurts, our own mortality or maybe just how much we don't want to know that someone is suffering.

It might not always be an easy thing to make the choice to love, but it is always an impacting and an important one. Someone once said that Love is often needed most when it is the hardest to share! Jesus says---With friends, enemies, at parties, with the sick, the rich, the poor, the happy, the sad, the troubled, the believers and the unbelievers, share it! Jesus did exactly this and in so doing poured the color into our colorless lives! He taught us what love really is and in so doing made life what God really wants it to be!

Our choices to love those in need are so abundant, but that's not all there is to it. Loving is something that we can do with each other in great times and just everyday regular old Tuesday afternoon circumstances as well. We can certainly tell folks we love them when we walk in the door from work or school. And we can also do loving things like do extra chores around the house...or...ask about, listen to and be interested in what is going on in someone's life... or...congratulate someone or take them to lunch or dinner because we're proud of them or even just because we want them to know how special they are to us!

We can't cover 35,000 options here. But we can grab onto the idea that love can be a good part of every part of our lives. God has given us this gift and this choice. I say, we take it!


